NORTH LINCOLNSHIRE museum

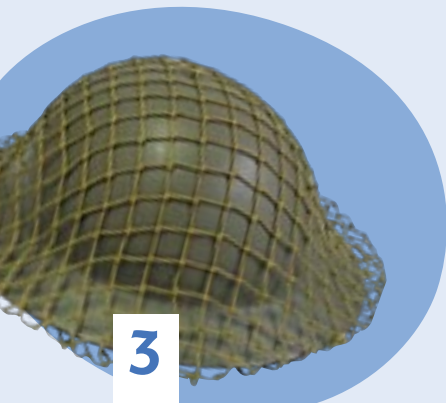

Take Cover - World War II

Curriculum links: History

Investigate a range of sources, including objects and documents, to discover how life would have been during the war. Experience a raid in our Anderson Shelter and pack an evacuee's suitcase.



The Mystery of Prehistory

Curriculum links: History

Investigate mysterious local finds and handmade replicas to discover how the people of North Lincolnshire developed during the Prehistoric Period. Compare life in the three periods using archaeological techniques in this multi-sensory workshop and enhance investigative skills through handling real and replica objects.

Anglo Saxon Lost Kingdom

Curriculum links: History

Meet Elthelfreda and discover the art and culture of the Anglo Saxons in Britain. Examine evidence from a local Anglo Saxon burial site, handle real and replica artefacts and dress up as an Anglo Saxon. Children will also make their own illuminated letter to take back to school.

Dress up in period clothes and use original dolly tubs, mangles and irons to discover what washday was like during the Victorian period.

Curriculum links: Science, Literacy, PHSE, PE

Science in the Garden

Curriculum links: Science

Many of our outdoor workshops are ideal for targeting specific students' needs including team working, communication and behavioural issues. The workshops in small groups can be delivered over a series of weeks or months.

Egyptian Life and Times

Use all your senses to experience Egyptian life and times. Handle replica artefacts, identify and select items for a tomb and mummify a body.

We recommend a free teacher pre-visit for every visit.

All Heritage workshops are 1 hour and 45 minutes unless otherwise stated.

All Art workshops are for 2 hours (half-day) or 4 hours (full-day), but can be tailored.

The maximum number of pupils we can cater for during a workshop is 36. For larger groups please enquire.
