

North Lincolnshire Museum Visual Story Transcript

This is a Visual Story for North Lincolnshire Museum. Below you will find two links. The first will take you on a virtual tour of the museum. The second link will give you more information about accessibility on your visit.

Arriving at the museum. There are two routes you can take to enter the Museum. You can walk around the front, along the path, or you can walk along Vicarage Gardens.

The main entrance is on Oswald Road. The Museum opens at 10 a.m. Monday to Saturday, at 1 p.m. on Sundays and closes at 4 p.m. everyday. It's free to come to the museum. You don't need to buy a ticket.

Museum entrance. When you walk in, you will see the shop. A member of the team will say hello when you arrive. You will also see a skeleton of the Winterton Lady near the entrance.

Facilities. This is where our toilets are too. We have male, female and accessible toilets with baby changing facilities. We have paper towels if you don't like using the hand dryer. You may need to use our lift. One of the Museum team will help you to use it.

People at the museum. Staff at the Museum wear black shirts that say North Lincolnshire Museum. They are here to help you enjoy your visit. Other people might be visiting the Museum too.

Places to sit. You will find seats near Dudley's Den, in the People's War Gallery, near the Main Entrance and in the Courtyard.

Stairs. We have two sets of stairs in the Museum. We also have a lift and accessibility ramp. Scan the QR code to visit the museum accessibility web page or speak to a member of staff to find out more.

Things that stay the same. As you travel through the Museum, you will see lots of exciting displays. Most of them stay the same.

Things that change. Our Main Gallery changes twice a year. Look at the Museum website to find out about the exhibition that's on when you visit. Sometimes different artists share their work in this space. We decorate the Museum for festivals like Halloween and Christmas. It can look different.

Calm spaces. If you need a break, you might like to spend some time in these spaces. They're all public spaces, so others may be using them at the same time. Dudley's Den is an area for the under 5s, so you may meet some little people here. You're welcome to use our sensory equipment if it supports you, no matter your age. It's on the Ground Floor. If you need fresh air, we have tables and chairs in the courtyard. The door is near the entrance. There is a dark space in the Anderson Shelter in the People's War Gallery. However, there are lots of noises, like sirens, in here too. It's on the Ground Floor.

Things you might see. There are darker areas like the Local History Gallery and the Anderson Shelter. There are also lighter places, like Dudley's Den and the Courtyard.

Things you might touch. You can touch lots of our objects in brackets like these. There are lots of things in the Ironstone Cottage. In some areas, you can play and dress up.

Things you might hear. Walkie talkies, music from the record player, other people enjoying the Museum or sirens near the Anderson Shelter.

Leaving the Museum. You will leave through the same door you arrive through. We hope you had a brilliant time and will visit us again soon.
